BREWERIES OF THE PAST

Does anyone reading this remember Day's brewery in Priory Lane, St.Neots by the river? Much of the old brewery has now disappeared but the old barley kiln remains and is now a scheduled monument, the riverside warehouses having been demolished recently to make way for new development. From 1780 the brewery was run by the Fowler family, but in 1814 when William Fowler the younger died the business was sold to John Day of Bedford. Included in the sale were 36 pubs in and around St.Ncots most of which are now closed. John Hill Day son of John Day presented the town with the obelisk that still stands on the market square. The brewery continued until Frank Day (great grandson of John Day), who was unmarried, died in 1919. The property was then sold in separate lots, the brewery being sold to Jordan and Addington, millers.
