THE GREAT BRITISH BEER FESTIVAL THE QUEENS HALL-LEEDS 12th to 16th AUGUST, 1981

Preparations are now well advanced for the biggest and best Beer Festival ever to be staged in the North of England. Yes, CAMRA's Great British Beer Festival is to be held at the Queens Hall, Leeds, from Wednesday 12th August to Sunday 16th August.

Orders are being placed for more than 125,000 pints of real ale, with traditional beers from more than 100 breweries in England, Scotland and Wales. In addition there will be traditional English Cider, and a range of fascinating old pub games where everyone can test their own skills.

The Great British Beer Festival will be open at lunchtime on Wednesday to Saturday (11a.m. to 3p.m.) and on Sunday (from midday), and in the evenings from 5.30p.m. to 10.30p.m. on Wednesday and Thursday, and from 5p.m. to lip.m. on Friday and Saturday. Admission will be 50p after 7p.m. on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and all day Saturday; at all other times admission will be FREE.
