PUB NEWS

There is a new landlord in the Longboat, Sapley, Huntingdon and also at the Angel in Ramsey, the former having moved from the Robin Hood, St. Ives. Both pubs serve Manns IPA.

The Old Falcon Hotel is now selling Bulmers medium cider by handpump.

The Bell at Stoneley is selling Charles Wells Bitter and IPA direct from the cellar but this must be asked for.

The Green Man, Leighton Bromswold is also under new ownership and is selling Tolly Original and Mild and Bass.

Dave Cox is now the new CAMRA Area Organiser and covers the St. Neots, Peterborough and Kings Lynn branches.

THE ISLE OF MAN

Anyone interested in traditional beer should not miss the delights of this island. There are two breweries on the island, Castletown (at Castletown) and Okells (at Douglas), all but one pub selling traditional beer. This one pub, the Keppel Hotel near Douglas, has no cellar and sells only keg Castletown beers. The Victoria in Castletown is the only Castletown pub to sell draught mild and to use gravity dispense for its beers.

Castletown brewery are running a passport scheme this year and a sticky label (each depicting the particular pub) can be obtained from everyone of their 35 hostelries and stuck into the passport. Just about all their pubs can be reached by public transport although one or two villages with pubs have only a very sparse bus service and careful planning is required. The longest walk was to the Keppel Hotel (1½ miles from the nearest bus stop); many of the other pubs were at bus stops and stations or in the towns. With 20 different labels in the passport you qualify for a certificate and are eligible to enter a prize draw (the first prize is a weeks holiday on the island next year). Okells are not running a similar scheme and personally I was rather thankful!

The great thing about the island is that during the summer months all the pubs are obliged to open from 10.30am until 11.00pm; during the winter they don't open until 12 noon.

Why can't we have the same hours in England???
