The Cross Keys, Upwood, now sells Mann's IPA on handpump.

The Bell, Southoe, has now gone real, with the introduction of Charles Wells bitter and bombardier on handpump.

The Stag and Hounds, Oldhurst, has Mann's IPA on handpump.

The Old Falcon, St. Neots, now has Adnams as well as Charrington's IPA.

The Peartree, Bassingbourne is selling the new stronger ale from the Mickles brewery "Oak Ale".

The White Swan, Bluntisham, has all the real Tolly ales available on handpump, bitter, mild and old strong.

WHITBREAD LUTON BREWERY VISIT

When an invitation from another CAMRA branch arrived to visit Britain's first Mega-Keggery namely Whitbread - Luton, gasps and horrors were abundant. As regular readers will be aware, we normally have no qualms in attempting to drink some unsuspecting brewery dry. However, three members did pluck up enough courage to accept and on a dark, cold and windy night in January, toured the brewery.

Fortunately, our fears of being forced to drink gassy beer were unfounded, as two casks of beer, Wethereds bitter and Winter Royal had been laid on especially for our visit, The first time real ale has been available at the brewery.

After a pint at the bar, we were shown around yards and yards of pipes, tanks, switches, dials and flashing lights without ever seeing any beer at all, but did manage to find the way back to the bar. A serious attempt was then made, with the help of high ranking CAMRA officials, including the National Chairman to persuade the Whitbread management to change their policy towards real ale.

Whether our efforts were a success, remains to be seen, but thanks to all at the brewery for the hospitality anyway.

JAMES PAINE BREWERY

The new local brewery have been selling off a few of the outlying pubs, The Three Cranes at Turvey and Ye Olde Plough at Bolnhurst, have been sold for around £100,000 each, The Prince of Wales at Upper Dean is still on the market. Perhaps the profit from the these sales will be used to modernise the rest of the brewery's houses?
